ARTHUR LESLIE (*alias* HENDERSON) is charged on warrant with uttering a forged cheque to Dr. Tudor Hora, Carlton, on the 29th ult. Offender is identical with Arthur Leslie, discharged to freedom, week ending 4th September, 1882 (*see P.G.*, 1881, page 217, under felonies). He now has pimples on his face, wears his beard all round but it is not very long, he wore snuff colored suit, and snuff colored overcoat, and black felt hat; was convicted at Sydney in August, 1879, for forgery and uttering. *See New South Wales criminal photos.* of 1879, No. 133. He was afterwards extradited to Victoria. There are five other charges of forgery and uttering against this offender.

Manslaughter.

£50 Reward. Whereas, on the 31st ult., Michael Bowe died in the Central Police Station, from the effects of injuries inflicted on him, on the 30th ult. And whereas, at an adjourned inquest held on the 4th inst., before the City Coroner, the following verdict was returned:—We find that the said Michael Bowe, at the Central Police Station, Sydney, on the 31st May, 1883, died from Compression of the Brain, the result of injuries unlawfully inflicted upon him, at Sydney, on the 30th day of the said month, by one Harry Smith *alias* Harry the Soldier, and so the jurors aforesaid, upon their oaths, further find that the said Harry Smith *alias* Harry the Soldier, the said Michael Bowe, in the manner, by the means aforesaid, at Sydney, on the 31st day of May last past, unlawfully and feloniously did kill and slay; And whereas a Coroner's warrant has been issued for the apprehension of the said Harry Smith *alias* Harry the Soldier, charging him with the manslaughter of the said Michael Bowe: Notice is hereby given, that a reward of £50 will be paid by the Government for such information as shall lead to apprehension of the said Harry Smith *alias* Harry the Soldier.

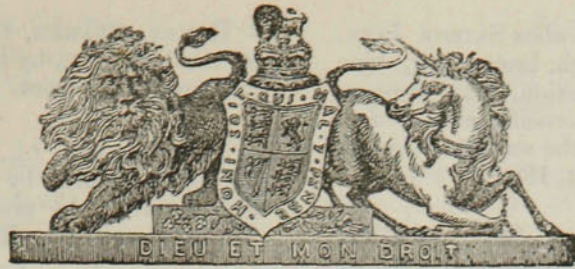
