Stealing in Dwellings, from the Person, &c.

Missing Friends.

Information is required respecting the present whereabouts of James *alias* Scotty Spinks, who was last heard of at Fremantle, in August, 1883, and is supposed to have left shortly afterwards for Albany, but inquiries at the latter place have failed to find him. Description—native of Montrose, Scotland, age 29 years, 5ft. 8in. high, medium build, fair complexion, fair hair, long face, blue eyes, regular teeth, curly hair, a brass finisher and iron fitter by trade. 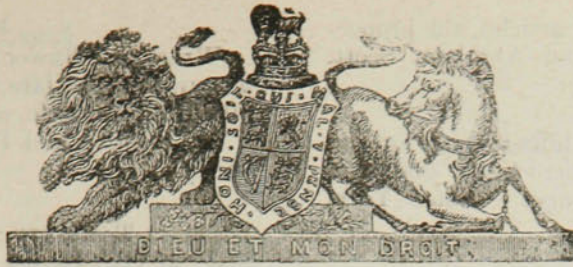
