MISSING FRIEND.

Inquiry is requested for Mrs. Ann Young, née MacDougall, who left Manchester, England, for Australia or New Zealand, about 30 years ago, with her husband. It is supposed they stayed some time in Melbourne. Mr. Young died, and his wife afterwards married a farmer whose name is unknown; he also died, and it is reported she was afterwards murdered, when preparing to leave for Scotland, by her own servant, and that the offender was executed. The woman sought for was born in Lochgilphead, Scotland, where a man named Malcolm Turner arrived from Australia or New Zealand some time ago, and has been making inquiries regarding her. Inquiry is made at the instance of Mrs. Mary Gale Ferguson née MacDougall, who writes from 19, Derby St., Levenshume, Manchester, regarding the missing friend, who was her aunt.

Mrs. Ferguson has heard that her aunt has left property, which is now in the hands of the Curator of Intestates of one of the Colonies, and that the man Turner, who she states is not related to the deceased, is endeavoring to claim the estate left by her.—O. 6681, 12th November, 1885.

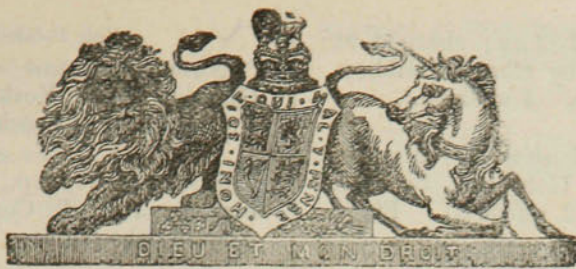
