## Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

C.O. <sup>9</sup>/<sub>901</sub>.—Officers in charge of Police Districts and Sub-Districts will be held responsible that the instructions contained in Circular Order No. 6/783, which is republished for the information of the Police throughout the Colony, are strictly adhered to, and that the Reports of Convictions of Aboriginal native offenders are promptly transmitted, as therein directed.

C.O. <sup>6</sup>/<sub>783</sub>.—His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct that in all future cases of Aboriginal Natives convicted under "The Aboriginal Native Offenders Act, 1883," the following instructions are to be strictly observed by the Police throughout the Colony, viz.:—

- (a.) To report at once, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, any instance in which the Report of Conviction is not attached to the Warrant of Commitment.
- (b.) To transmit immediately, for the perusal of His Excellency the Governor, every Report of Conviction received by them from a Magistrate or Justice of the Peace.

By direction of His Excellency the Governor the attention of officers of the Government is directed to the following Colonial Office Regulation, the provisions of which are to be strictly adhered to:—

76. All salaried officers are prohibited from engaging in trade or connecting themselves with any commercial undertaking without leave from the Governor, approved by the Secretary of State. As a general rule this prohibition will be made absolute in the case of officers whose remuneration is fixed on the assumption that their whole time is at the disposal of the Government.

2. This Circular is issued because it is observed that there are cases in which salaried officers have, without permission, allowed their names to appear as Directors of Gold-mining or other Companies. This being contrary to the above Regulation, cannot be permitted.

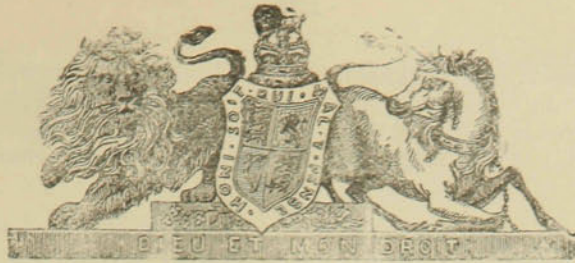

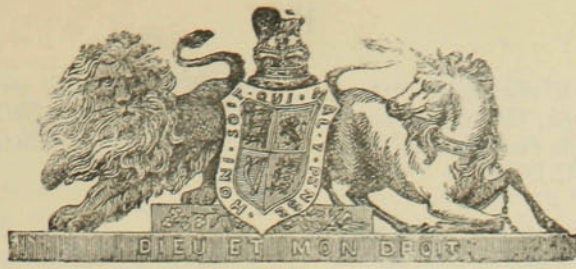

## ELECTRIC TELEGRAPHS.

C.O. <sup>9</sup>/<sub>904</sub>.—The attention of the Police throughout the Colony is directed to the practice of causing wilful damage to Telegraph wires, insulators, and poles by stone throwing, in order that they may use special efforts to check it. They should, when on patrol or other duty, not only keep a sharp look-out for stone throwers, but should, from time to time, direct their attention to the condition of the insulators, etc.; noticing, as can easily be done, whether they are intact or broken; in order that, if breakages

of recent date are observable, inquiry may be promptly made on the spot. Any injuries discovered should be reported to the local Postmaster.

(2.) Offences of this class can be prosecuted under The Electric Telegraph Protection Act, 47th Victoria, No. 12, Sections 11, 12, and 13.

(3.) A Constable may apprehend the offender on the spot, but unless there is reason to believe that such offender would endeavor to evade a summons, the process should be by summons.

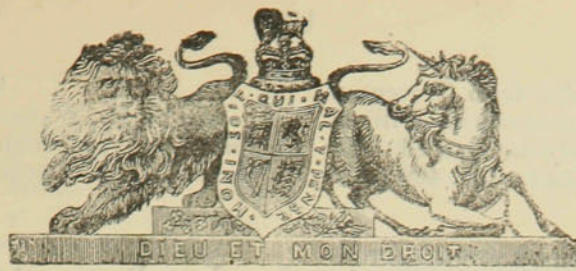
