## Robbery under Arms.

On the 3rd instant, at about 10 a.m., Mr. W. H. MORTIMER and Mr. CROOKS, of the Lake View Consols Gold Mining Company, were stuck up on the Boulder Road, near Kalgoorlie, by a man armed with a rifle, and robbed of the sum of £100 in silver coins; the same being contained in a small leather brief bag, bearing the letters "H.G.G." or "H.G.D." in gilt letters on the flap.

*Special Inquiry* is to be made to trace this offender. He is described as: Medium build, age 35 to 40 years, about 5ft. 4in. high, black hair, dark eyes, thin visage, sallow complexion, dressed in dark coat, brownish trousers, and black felt hat, wearing a mask and carrying a Winchester rifle; may be identical with Barney Smith, who left Kalgoorlie about Christmas last, supposed for Norseman. This man was suspected of stealing the rifle mentioned in *Police Gazette*, 1898, page 414, A1/11171. He answers to the description given above, and is said to have been convicted in New Zealand of destroying some building by an explosion of dynamite.

The rifle used by the offender has been recovered on the route taken by him. It is identical with the one reported stolen from the shop of R. P. Beard, Kalgoorlie (*vide P.G.*, 1899, p. 112, A2/952).

## Payment of Accounts at Treasury Out-stations.

Claims must be made payable to a Bank, or to the public creditor, or other person concerned, at the Treasury Out-station, and not to the Commissioner of Police; and claimants should be directed to call at the Treasury Office for payment within a reasonable period after the account has been forwarded to Chief Office.
