ACCOUNTS.

C.O. $\frac{43}{1903}$.—In the rearrangement of votes in the Estimates for the current year the following items of expenditure are included in "Incidental":—

Postage, Stationery, Arms, etc.; Information, Remounts, Rent, Fuel and Light, Sanitary, Water, Photography, Cooking at Lockups.

It is only necessary, therefore, to quote the item "Incidental" on any requisitions for services or supplies connected with the various items now included in that sub-head. Similarly with accounts, any charges under the items named can be included in the one claim.

"Travelling and Transport" and "Transport of Unsentenced Prisoners" are also amalgamated under the one sub-head "Travelling and Transport."

The space provided in the account form (N) for "Sub-head of Service" should be left intact, as the required particulars will be entered when the vouchers are checked at the Chief Office.

C.O. 44/1903.—With reference to C.O. 40/1903, it has been decided, in view of the difficulties encountered in carrying out the instructions regarding the non-acceptance of cheques in payment of revenue, unless marked "Good," that the rule is to be strictly enforced only in cases where the cheque is paid in return for consideration given by the State, or the amount is tendered as security. At the same time every care must be exercised in accepting cheques on the Public Account.

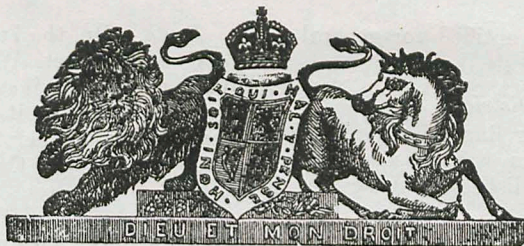

PAY AND ALLOWANCE SHEETS.

C.O. $\frac{45}{1903}$.—It is imperative, under the new system of payment of salaries and allowances adopted by the Treasury, that the receipted vouchers (including native trackers' allowance sheets and travelling allowance sheets) be returned to the Chief Office for transmission to the Treasury as soon as the disbursements are made.

District Officers will, therefore, make suitable arrangements for payment of such moneys to the police, so as to minimise delay to the utmost in obtaining and forwarding the acquittances to Chief Office. In some cases members of the force on leave of absence have been the cause of unnecessary detention of pay and allowance sheets owing to their neglect to arrange for the disposal of their moneys during the period of leave.

In future cases where the absence of a member of the force from his district precludes him from attending and receiving moneys payable to him at the customary time of payment, he must submit a procuracy order, so that all such sums can be dealt with promptly and the monthly pay and allowance sheets returned to Head Office without any delay.

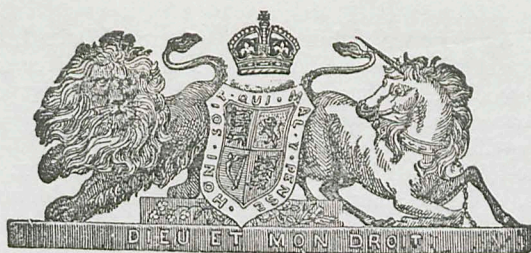

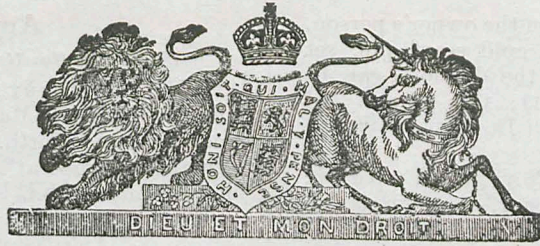

No. 49/1903.—With reference to C.O. 12/1903, it has now been decided that the police shall, when required, render immediate temporary assistance in the case of any patient in the Public Hospitals who may develop violent symptoms. Further outside help, however, must be engaged immediately, in order to promptly relieve the police of the control of the patient (except in the case of a prisoner) and the required assistance should be afforded the Medical Officer in securing the services of a suitable person for this purpose.

COMMONWEALTH IMMIGRATION RESTRICTION ACT

(1 Edw. 7, No. 17, Section 8).
