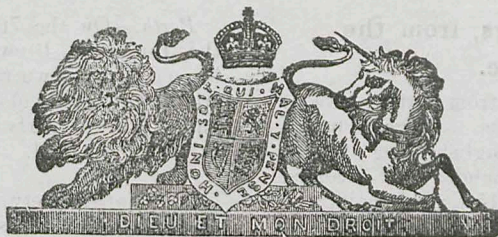

His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following amendment to the Rules and Regulations for the West Australian Police Benefit Fund, framed under the provisions of 30 Victoria, No. 10, and 48 Victoria, No. 18, and dated the 4th day of January, 1898.

Regulation No. 1.—Insert the following paragraph at the end:—

- (5). Fees and mileage received by members of the Police Force in serving process of a Local Court, under Section 10, of 58 Victoria, No. 13, except such fees as are allowed to members of the Police Force duly appointed as Bailiffs under Police Regulation 410.

C.O. 23/1904.—The Hon. the Minister has been pleased to approve of the following amendments of the regulations for the government and guidance of the Police Force of Western Australia, framed the 18th day of April, 1898, under the provisions of section 9 of "The Police Act, 1892."

Regulation 410 is hereby cancelled, and the following is substituted therefor:

410. In the service of summons or other process of a Local Court (not being a writ of execution) by a member of the Police Force under section 10 of 58 Victoria, No. 13, the following provisions shall be carried out:—

(a.) Where a member of the Police Force is appointed Bailiff of a Local Court, with the approval of the Commissioner, he will be at liberty to receive all fees, mileage,

etc., payable to Bailiffs, and to retain the same, provided he finds his own mode of conveyance.

- (b.) Where no Bailiff is available, members of the Police Force are directed to serve summonses or other process of a Local Court, but all fees, mileage, etc., shall be paid to the Police Benefit Fund.

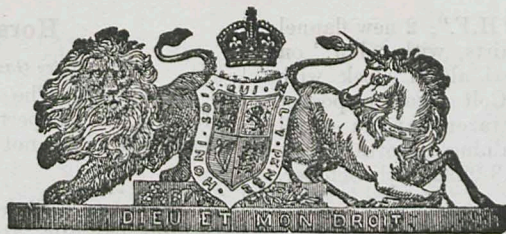

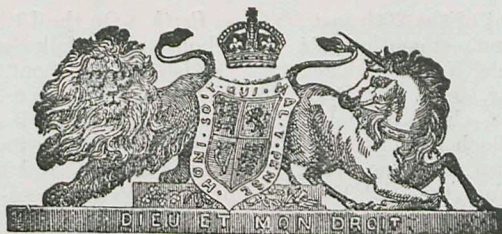
