## Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

C.O.  $\frac{34}{1905}$ .—The following instructions in regard to the conveyance by the police of patients committed to the Hospital for the Insane are to be strictly observed in future:—

The use of the prison van for conveyance of lunatics will be discontinued, and the patients are to be brought by cab from the railway station to the Hospital for Insane.

The police escorting patients are to appear in private clothes and not in uniform.

Female patients under escort should in every case be accompanied by a female attendant or nurse in addition to the constable.

The services of a nurse from the Lunacy Department will be made available to the police for the purpose of escorting female patients committed to the Hospital for the Insane at any point on the Great Southern and South-Western lines, the Eastern Goldfields line as far as Menzies, and the Midland line as far as Geraldton. The nurses' expenses will be borne by the Lunacy Department. From the North-West and other places beyond the area stated above, a respectable female should be engaged by the police, whose expenses will be defrayed by the Lunacy Department.

Due notice should be given by wire to the officer-in-charge of the Hospital for Insane when the services of a nurse are required.

In other cases where it may not be possible to engage the services of a female attendant, immediate notice of the fact should be despatched to the Hospital for Insane.

Officers should see that the expenses referred to above are made chargeable to the Lunacy Department.

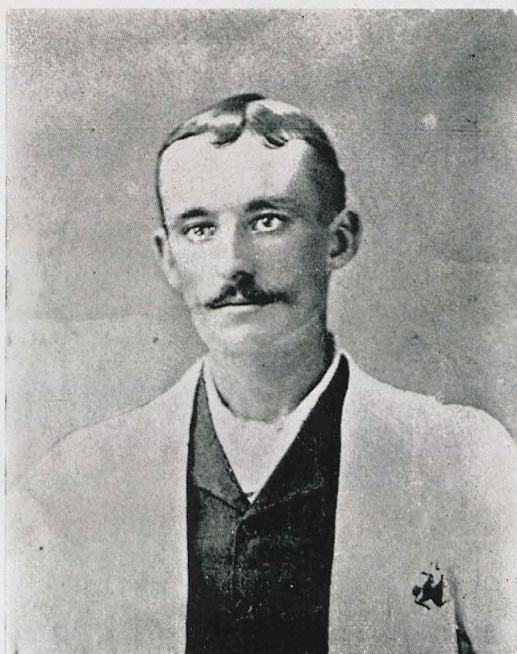
