Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

"WHITE SLAVE TRAFFIC."

C.O. 11/1906.—An Agreement has been entered into between Great Britain and several Countries for the purpose of, as far as possible, keeping in check the "White Slave Traffic," or the procuring of women and girls for immoral purposes.

In accordance with this Agreement Officers in Charge of Districts are directed:—

1. To collect information generally dealing with the subject.
2. To have a watch kept at railway stations and ports on persons suspected of being engaged in this traffic.
3. To communicate with the women and girls, the victims of this traffic, so as to arrange for the repatriation of those who desire to return to their own country, and for placing them in suitable homes pending repatriation.
4. To keep under observation agencies which offer women and girls situations abroad.

All information obtained must be at once forwarded to the Chief Office.

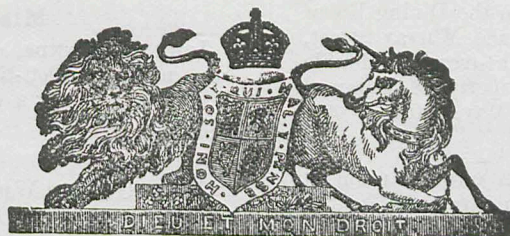

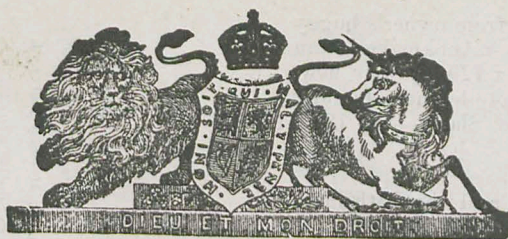
