Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

C.O. 1907.—The Second-hand Dealers' Act, 1906, will come into force on the 1st day of January, 1907.

Officers in charge of districts, and sub-officers and constables in charge of stations, will be careful to see that the provisions of this Act are strictly complied with.

Every person licensed under the Act must keep a book in the form hereunder, and such book, the shop, and the license of such person may be inspected by any member of the Police Force at all reasonable times.

This duty is to be carried out with discretion, and nothing must be done to in any way harass a licensee.

Licensees should be furnished with a form showing the description of book to be kept. This will assist the police and themselves until copies of the Act are distributed and licenses issued by Police and Resident Magistrates.

Copies of the Act will be furnished to Police Stations as soon as possible.

directed to Regulations 391-395, and 434-451, which must be carefully and promptly observed:—

Criminal informations of whatsoever nature, copy warrants, with full personal description of offenders, notices of arrest, also of cancellation of warrants, and any other information which may be of use in the prevention and detection of crime, must be forwarded to the Officer-in-charge, Criminal Investigation Branch, Perth, *direct by the first opportunity*, and must be written in ink.

Criminal informations must contain all available information; and descriptions of property and of offenders or suspects should be given as minutely as possible, special attention being paid to Regulation 439.

In the event of a serious robbery or other serious crime, the details, in as concise a form as possible, must be at once telegraphed to the Officer-in-charge, Criminal Investigation Branch, Perth, and full particulars forwarded by first post.

Correspondence and queries from the officer in charge of that Branch, Perth, must be promptly attended to, and returned *direct*. A practice has lately arisen in some districts of sending replies through the district officer. This not only occasions delay in the conduct of the investigation, but may frequently interfere with the detection of crime, and it also necessitates double postage.

The Commissioner trusts that he will not again have to draw attention to this matter.

C.O. 1907.—Cases have recently been brought to notice where stores have not been purchased from contractors and in accordance with contract rates. This is more especially the case in the North-West districts. Attention is therefore called to Tender Board Regulation 52, as follows:—

“As far as possible all purchases of stores shall be of the kind specified in Tender Board contracts, or in the price lists of manufacturing departments of the Government.”

Officers making unauthorised purchases will be held personally liable, and surcharged with the expenditure, unless as provided for in Police Regulation 490.

A copy of the Tender Board Regulations has now been issued to each District Officer.

FINGER PRINTS.

C.O. ⁵/₁₉₀₇.—The following extract from the *Government Gazette* of the 21st December, 1906, is published for general information:—

No. 12238.—C.S.O.

GAOL REGULATIONS.

*Colonial Secretary's Office,
Perth, 21st December, 1906.*

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Regulation under the provisions of "The Prisons Act, 1903," and "Prisons Amendment Act, 1906" (Section 2), in lieu of No. 145 of the existing Gaol Regulations:—

145.—Every prisoner shall submit himself or herself to be photographed, and to have the prints of his or her fingers, measurements, and other particulars taken and recorded on reception and discharge; and also at any other time when ordered by the Comptroller General. Any photograph or finger prints taken of any person under remand or committed for trial, who shall not be ultimately convicted, shall, with the plates, be destroyed and not recorded.

The term "prisoner" in the above Act is defined as "any person committed to prison for punishment or on remand, or for trial, safe custody, or otherwise."

It will not be necessary to take the photograph or finger prints of every convicted prisoner, but care must be taken that all persons convicted of any indictable offence, or of any serious simple offence, such as assault, disorderly conduct, vagrancy, etc., are photographed and finger printed.

The taking of photographs will apply only in cases where the Police photographer is available.

When a prisoner is on remand, charged with any offence, his finger prints must be taken, when, from the character of the offence with which he is charged, or for other reasons, there are grounds for suspecting that he has been previously engaged in crime, or when there is reason to believe that the taking of his finger prints will afford evidence as to the commission of an offence.

The finger prints of an unconvicted prisoner should be forwarded to the Officer-in-charge, Criminal Investigation Branch, Perth, by first post, when they will be classified, and a reply sent, stating whether the accused can be identified or not.

At stations on the railway system a remand for eight days should be obtained, in order that ample time may be given to obtain the required information.

At stations outside the railway system the prints of an accused person must be taken and forwarded for classification; but as it would be impossible to obtain a reply within a reasonable time, the charge should be proceeded with in the usual way.

The terms "reception" and "discharge" in the regulation mean a reasonable time after the prisoner is received into the gaol or lock-up, and a reasonable time before the prisoner's discharge.

The attention of officers in charge of districts, and of sub-officers and constables in charge of stations, is also directed to the use of finger prints in relation to the detection of crime.

This system, intelligently applied, is capable of rendering the greatest possible assistance to the police in the detection of all classes of crime and the identification of the offender; and it is very advisable that every member of the Force should take every opportunity of making himself acquainted with it.

Very little experience will show that it is almost impossible to handle any article without leaving a more or less greasy mark on it. This mark, sometimes almost invisible to the naked eye, can be developed in such a way as to render it distinctly visible and capable of giving a good photographic picture.

Glass, china, silver and electro-plated ware, polished metal of all kinds, varnished wood, papier-mâché, cash boxes, and in fact all articles having a smooth surface, partly dried varnish or paint, putty, wax candles, etc., will yield good impressions; paper, particularly the glazed kinds, also gives satisfactory results.

It must, however, be understood that, to render the system of value, it is absolutely necessary that the article which bears, or is supposed to bear, finger marks of an offender, should not be handled with the unprotected fingers until it has been examined by an expert. Not only are the marks likely to be obliterated or defaced, but the addition of fresh marks renders the task of development and examination more difficult.

In cases of burglary or housebreaking, where entrance is gained by forcing a window or glass door, examination of the broken pieces of glass will frequently disclose finger marks. In similar cases it is very difficult for an offender to push back the catch of a window from the outside without leaving marks on the lower pane.

In cases of murder, in addition to the usual places to be searched, blood-stained marks may be found on the clothing or on the skin of the deceased.

In cases of ordinary crime, small articles which bear finger marks may be packed carefully in tissue paper or cotton wool, placed in a small box, and forwarded to the Officer in charge of the Criminal Investigation Branch, Perth, by registered post, each article being previously marked for identification by the member of the Force who found it.

In very serious offences, such as murder, or burglary, etc., accompanied with violence, where finger marks of offenders are discovered, it would be advisable to wire at once to the Officer in charge of

the Criminal Investigation Branch, Perth, with a view of an expert being sent to investigate; but care must be taken that, whilst waiting for a reply, the articles bearing the marks are not disturbed or handled.

To prevent unnecessary expense and waste of time it should be borne in mind that finger marks are useless unless there is some detail: that is to say, unless the pattern formed by the ridges or raised lines of the fingers is visible.

ECONOMY IN THE USE OF POSTAGE STAMPS.

C.O. $\frac{6}{1907}$.—Strict economy must in future be exercised in the use of Postage Stamps in correspondence and telegrams transmitted either to the Chief Office, or from Station to Station.

The Postal Regulations now provide that "all papers and documents not *wholly printed* which have not the character of 'actual or personal correspondence' can be forwarded as 'Commercial Papers,' on which only the packet rate is charged, viz., 1d. for 2ozs."

In future, therefore, all returns, vouchers (receipted or otherwise), travelling claims, way bills, and any other documents that can properly be forwarded in such manner must be enclosed in the ordinary official wrapper, open at each end, and *not in envelopes*. Only the printed wrapper should be used.

Should the Postal Authorities demand extra rates at any time the matter must be reported at once to Chief Office in order that the reason for any additional charge can be ascertained and action taken as necessary.

Regulation 673 requires that the telegraph is not to be used where a communication by post will answer the purpose. Many of the telegrams sent are also unnecessarily lengthy, and might be considerably condensed without affecting the sense of the message, or rendering it less clear. The Regulation must, therefore, be strictly observed.

An effort must also be made to avoid the despatch of large files from one district to another, or from Station to Station, where an extract or separate letter would meet the case. Files relating to missing friends, wife deserters, etc., might in many instances be so treated, and considerable postage saved.

District Officers will please see that every effort is put forward to give effect to this order, and to reduce the cost of postage, and any instance in which it is disobeyed should be reported to me.

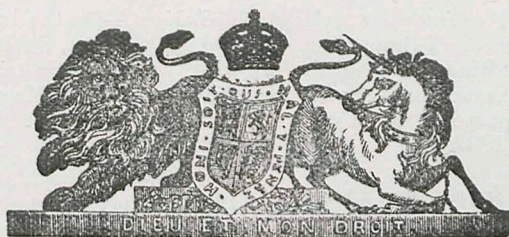

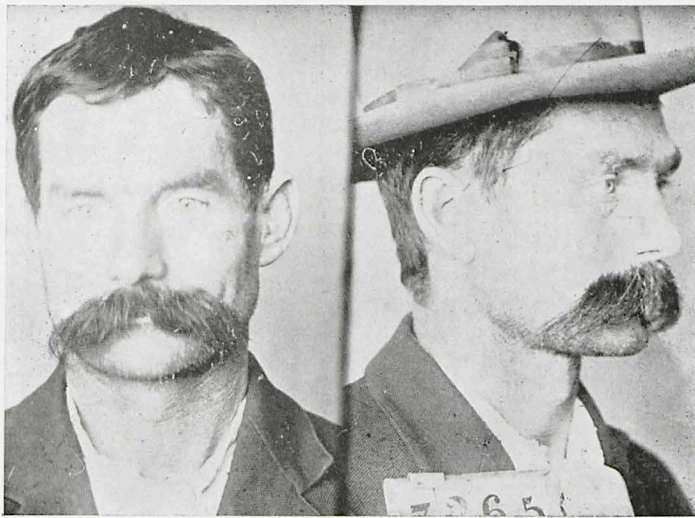
