Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

Circular from the Honorable the Colonial Secretary, dated 4th Jan., 1890.

C.O. ⁶/₉₁₆.—His Excellency the Administrator directs that, in all cases when practicable, arrangements should be made for the safe conduct back to their own country of discharged Native Offenders and of Native Witnesses; and that the engagement for service of such offenders and witnesses beyond the limits of their own country should not be encouraged. Government Residents, Police Magistrates, Resident Magistrates, and the Police are directed to see that these instructions are carried out.

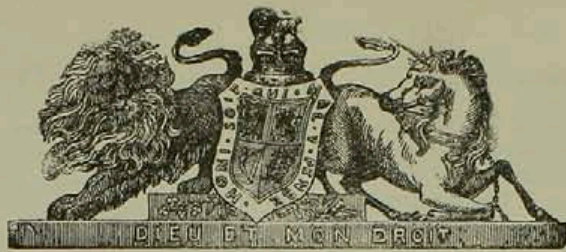

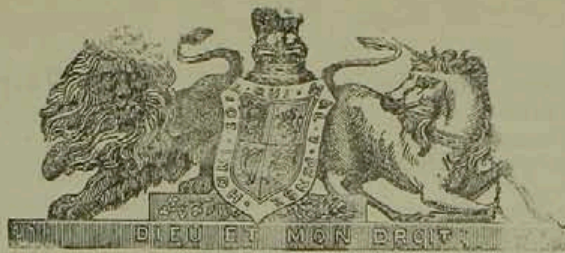

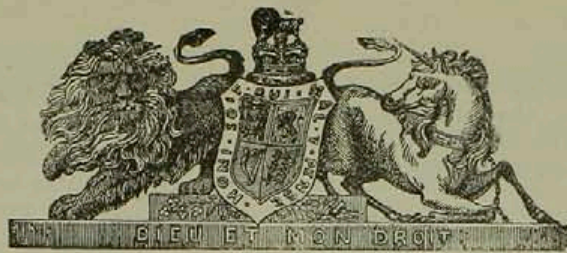
