## Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

C.O. <sup>6</sup>/<sub>1001</sub>.—In future the following Instructions relating to the Receipt and Issue of Stores at the various Police Stations throughout the Colony are to be strictly carried out:—

Officers in charge of Districts will, in the Store Ledger furnished for that purpose, keep a half-yearly account of Stores at each Station in their Districts.

Officers in charge of Stations will be furnished with a similar ledger, in which a half-yearly account will be kept of all stores received, issued, or expended, as well as stores remaining on hand from the preceding half-year. They will also, on the 1st January and 1st July in each year, forward, on the form now in use, a half-yearly return of stores to the Officer in charge of the District, who, after carefully checking and comparing it with his store ledger, will forward it to the Chief Office.

In conjunction with the Store Ledger, a Requisition Book will be kept at each Station, in which all stores received, whether on approved requisitions, or purchased under pressing necessity, are to be entered. This also applies to Officers in charge of Districts, who will keep a Requisition Book so as to be able to check the receipts in the half-yearly returns of stores sent in from Stations.

All requisitions for stores must be sent through the Officers in charge of Districts, as well as all invoices of stores forwarded from Head Quarters.

Should stores be purchased under pressing necessity by any member of the Force, a report must at once be made to the Officer in charge of the District, showing the necessity for such purchase.
