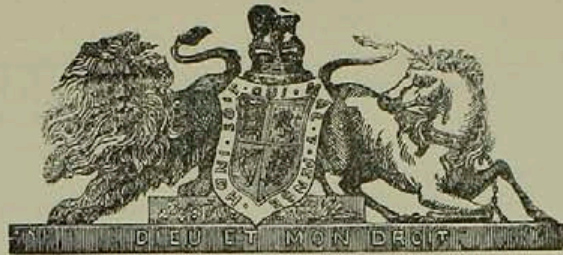

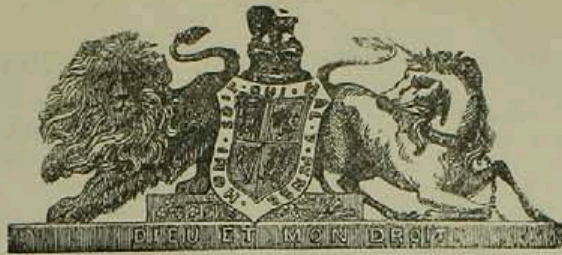

The human remains are described as those of an old European male of tall stature, feet deformed from use of tight boots, and hands those of a man unaccustomed to hard work; teeth drawn. The dog was probably a young cross-bred animal, with light coloured smooth coat, and of medium size. The body of the man was lying on the left side and bore the remnants of a cotton shirt, moleskin trousers, and blucher boots, the latter being little worn, right boot being cut away at heel, evidently on account of sore.
