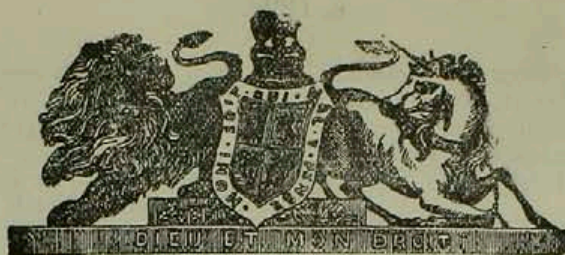

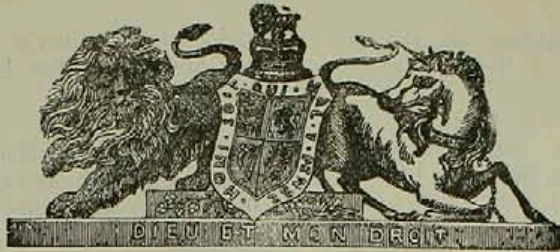

## Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

### *The Dog Act, 1883.*

C.O.  $\frac{9}{95}$ .—The Bureau of Agriculture having urged upon the Government the necessity for further restricting the number of dogs kept by aboriginal natives, also for providing more effective registration of dogs and the destruction of unregistered dogs, the Police throughout the Colony are directed to enforce the provisions of "The Dog Act, 1883," and "The Dog Act Amendment Act of 1885," in order to abate the annoyance and injuries occasioned by the number of dogs infesting the streets and highways in towns, and to cause the destruction of dogs kept by aboriginal natives in excess of the number allowed by law.

Aboriginal natives residing in towns, or within settled districts where there is no game, do not need unregistered dogs, and any kept by them are to be destroyed.

The attention of the Police is directed to Section 13 of "The Dog Act, 1883," under which they are liable to a penalty if they fail to report unregistered dogs; also to Section 5 of "The Dog Act Amendment Act, 1885," which restricts the number of unregistered dogs to be kept by an aboriginal native to one.

NOTE.—Subsistence Money—Officers in charge of Districts throughout the Colony will receive Travelling Allowance while absent from Head Quarters Station on duty. Other members of the force, including native trackers stationed in the Kimberley and Roebourne Districts, and at stations in the Western and North-Eastern Districts, where Ration Allowance is granted, will receive the allowance while employed on gold escort duties, or as orderlies to public officers. When employed on ordinary duties, they will receive the allowance while travelling beyond the boundary of the District they are supposed to patrol—such boundary to be defined by the officer in charge of the District—subject to approval.

At stations on the Coolgardie Goldfields, also at Dundas, Esperance Bay, and Eucla, members of the force, including native trackers, will receive the allowance when absent from their Stations on duty, but they must supply themselves with fresh water when travelling.

At Stations where Ration Allowance is not granted, Travelling Allowance (according to regulated scale) will be allowed.

When a member of the force is entitled to Travelling Allowance, and is absent from his usual place of residence a day and a night, the whole daily allowance will be granted. Half such daily allowance will be granted, except when the fixed allowance of 2s. 6d. is given, when the duty admits of a return the same day, and the absence is not less than five hours.

The regulation contained in C.O. 6847, as regards travelling by steamer or sailing vessel, still remains in force, and when making claims for the allowance, when the travelling is partly by sea, officers will be careful to note on the face of the Special Duty Sheet, that time spent on board ship is not included.

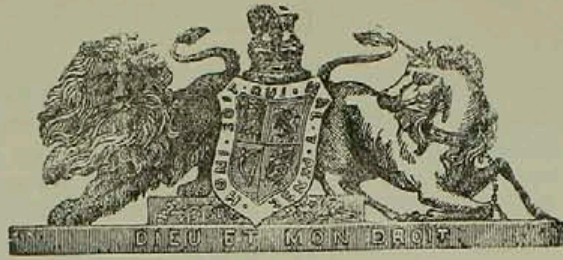
