Stealing in Dwellings, from the Person, &c.

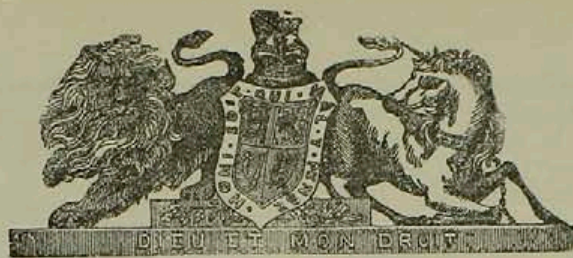

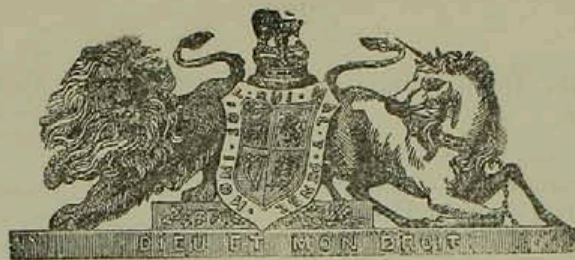
