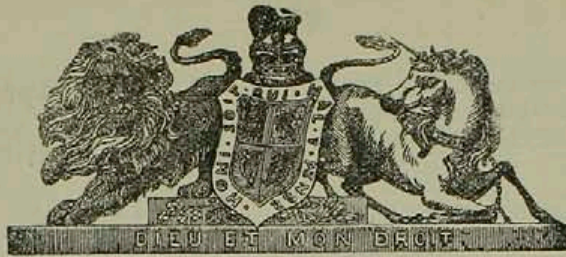

## Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

### PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

C.O.  $\frac{1}{2}$ .—Police Officers and Constables who hold appointments under, or who incur expenditure on account of departments other than the Police Department, are not to make their claims payable to the Commissioner of Police. They must arrange with the Department concerned for the payment of the amounts. This will also apply to private persons who perform services for other departments on requisitions issued by members of the Police Force. Instead of making their accounts payable to the Commissioner of Police they must arrange with the Department concerned for payment.

With regard to expenditure on account of the Police Department, public creditors should, as far as possible, arrange with an agent or bank to receive their moneys, and should only make their claims payable to the Commissioner of Police when it would put them to great inconvenience to make any other arrangement.

Claims chargeable to the Public Works Department, such as sanitary service, etc., must be rendered in duplicate.

Officers in charge of districts and sub-districts will be held responsible that these instructions are strictly carried out.

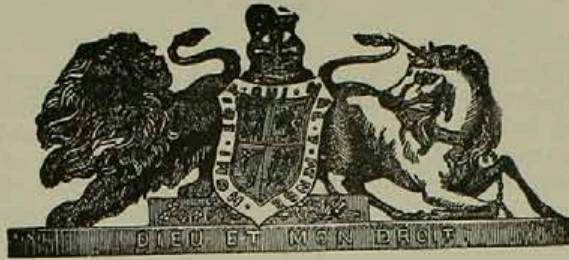

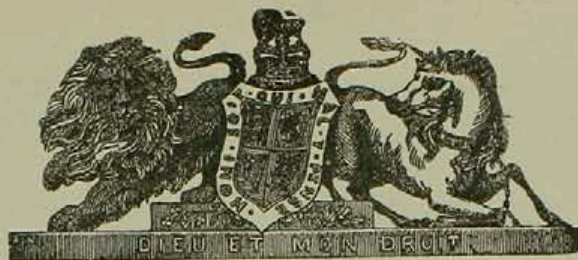
