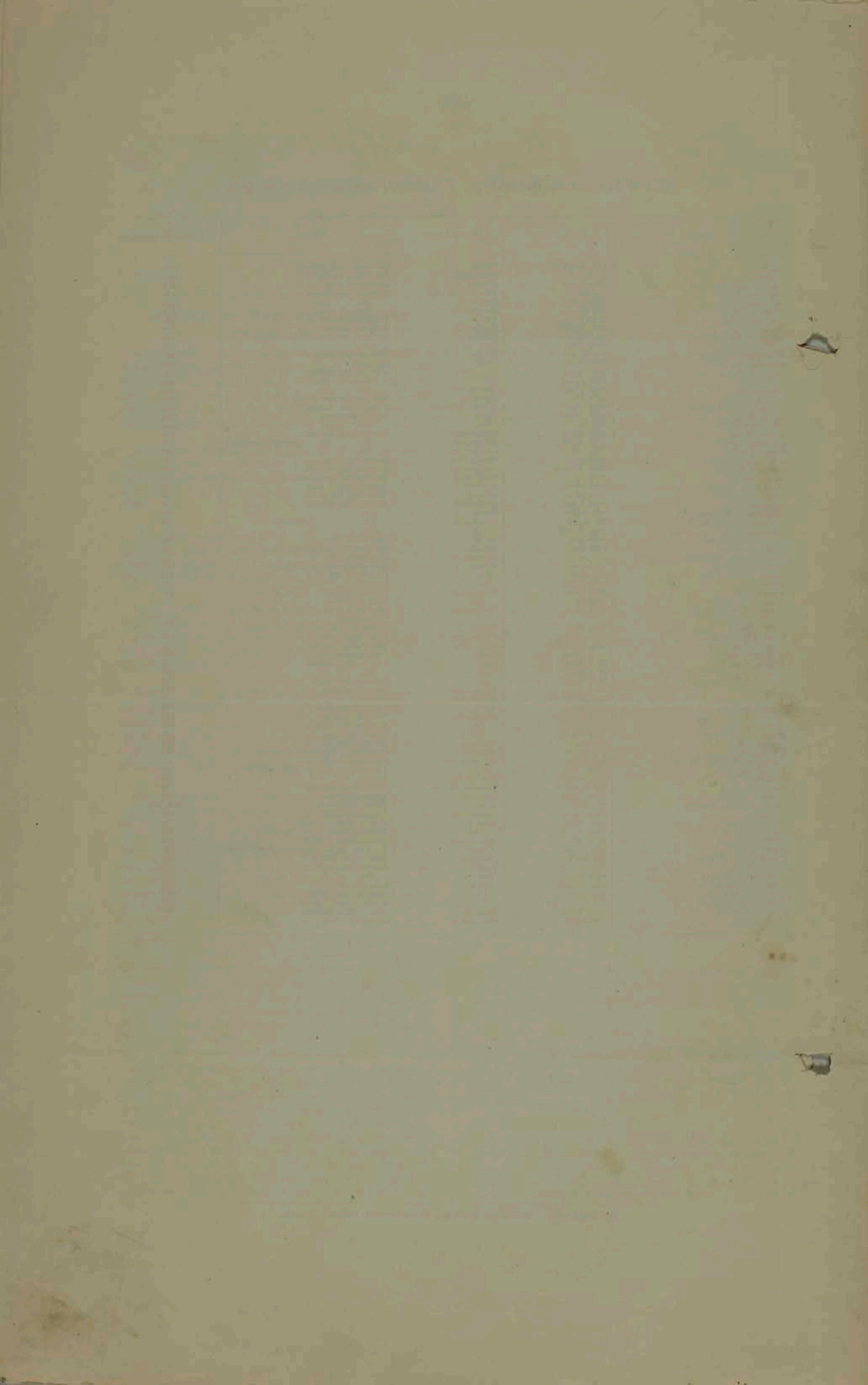

NOTE.—*Subsistence Allowance.*—Members of the Force (except as specified below) will be entitled to claim the full daily rate when the special duty necessitates their absence from their usual places of residence a day and night. Half the daily allowance only will be granted when the duty admits of a return the same day, and the absence is not less than five hours. For journeys between Perth, Fremantle, and Guildford, however, a fixed allowance of two shillings and sixpence, in accordance with C.S.O. 3534, of 25th July, 1888, will be made to members of the Force proceeding to those places and returning the same day, provided the absence is not less than five hours.

In the Kimberley, Roebourne, and Ashburton Districts, and at stations in the Western District where ration allowance is granted, members of the Force, exclusive of District Officers, are entitled to receive travelling allowance when travelling on gold-escort duty or as orderlies to public officers. When employed on ordinary Police duty they will be granted the allowance only while travelling beyond the limits of their sub-district, the boundaries of which are to be defined and submitted for approval by the District Officers.

The regulation contained in C.O. 6/847, with regard to travelling by sea, remains in force, and, in forwarding claims for special duty allowance, officers will be careful to ascertain that the time spent on board ship is not included.

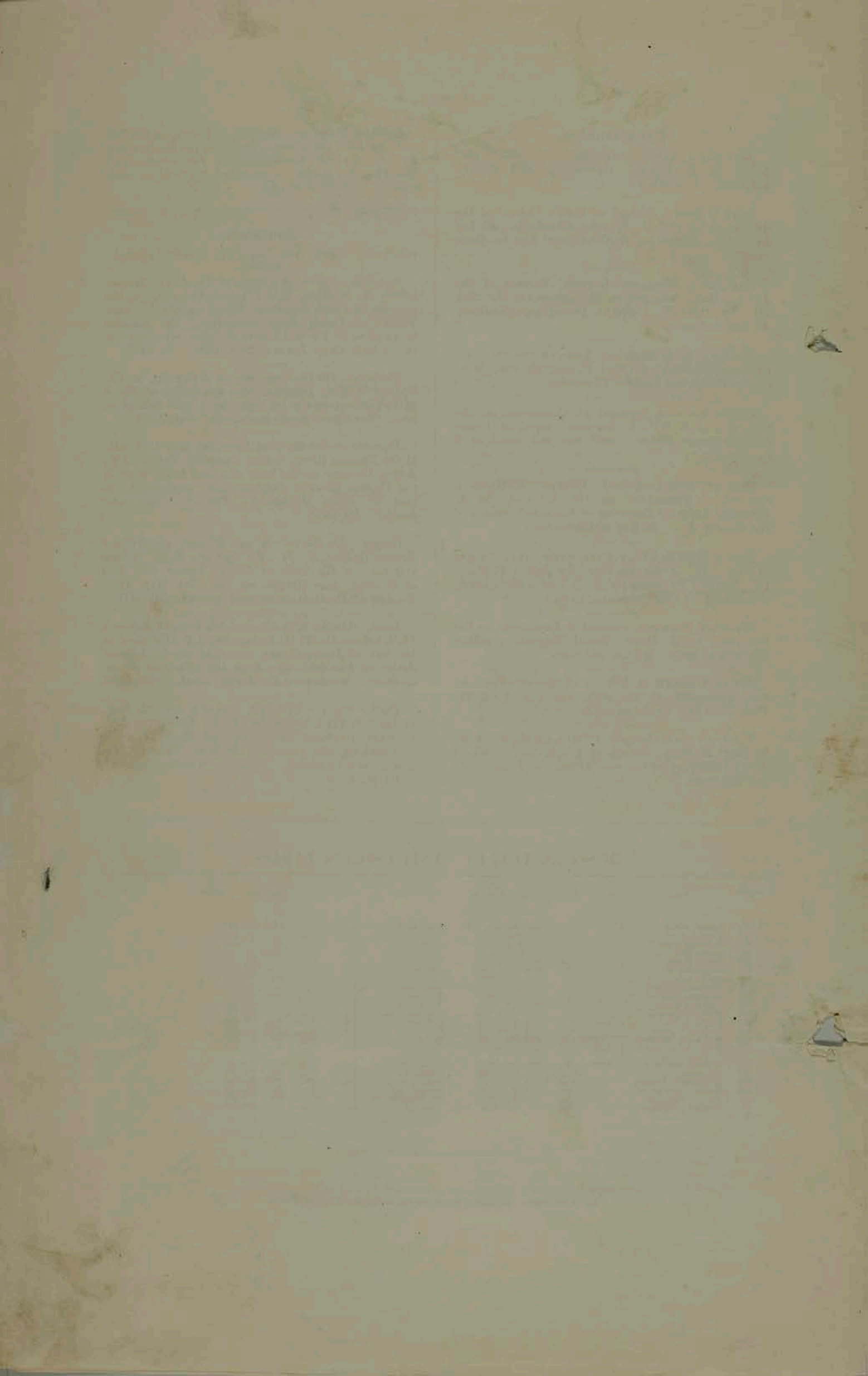

## Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

### ALLOWANCE FOR MAINTENANCE OF NATIVE TRACKERS.

C.O.  $\frac{3}{8}$ .—In future the salaries of Native Trackers will not appear on the monthly pay-sheets.

Instead, however, each member of the Force who has charge of a Police Native Tracker will be entitled to submit a claim on the usual form (N) for the native's maintenance, at the present rate per diem, for the actual number of days he has been employed, up to and inclusive of the 20th of each month. Such claims, after certification by the District Officer, must be forwarded in time to reach the Chief Office by the 28th of the month. The name of the Native Tracker must be inserted in the account.

At inland Stations where the lack of speedy postal communication would not admit of the account reaching the Chief Office by the required date, District Officers may arrange for an earlier closure of the claim than that fixed above.

In the Roebourne and Kimberley Districts, the claims for the allowance can be submitted to the Resident Magistrate for payment, with the ordinary contingent accounts for the month.
